Drug Offenses

<u>This primer</u> provides an overview of the statutes, sentencing guidelines, and case law applicable to federal drug offenses.

Firearms Offenses

<u>This primer</u> provides a general overview of the statutes, sentencing guidelines, and case law relating to sentencing of firearms offenses. In particular, this primer discusses the application of the firearms guideline, §2K2.1 (Unlawful Receipt, Possession, or Transportation of Firearms or Ammunition; Prohibited Transactions Involving Firearms or Ammunition), and firearms-related enhancements in guidelines that cover other offenses.
